



2021 Indigenous Bowl Brings Tribes Together at U.S. Bank Stadium

Being invited to play in the 7G Foundation Indigenous Bowl is an honor for all those involved and a memory that will last a lifetime for the select high school football players chosen for the rooster. This year, 13 South Dakotans were invited to play in the 2021 Indigenous Bowl. Among them was Richard Hagen, the son of Oelrichs Lead Highway Maintenance Worker Shayne Hagen.

Fifty-four native student-athletes representing over 30 tribes took the field at U.S. Bank Stadium, home of the Minnesota Vikings on Sunday, Dec. 5, 2021. The days prior to kickoff, the athletes were able to participate in leadership training, attend speeches from various coaches, and tour the Vikings stadium.

Hagen, a linebacker who represented the Oglala Lakota Sioux Tribe and Pine Ridge High School at the game, was a member of the Gold Team (a.k.a the "Golden Boyz"). The game was closely contested throughout, but the Gold Team claimed an 18-14 victory.

When the final buzzer rang, both teams could consider themselves winners because of the relationships built and lifetime memories created.

Congratulations to Richard Hagen on being able to take part in such a memorable event and to represent South Dakota on the big stage.


ArcGIS Enterprise and what you need to know!

This month, the GIS team would like to highlight an important change that will occur soon for all SDDOT staff who utilize an iPad for mobile data collection.

With the transition of our online data to the new ArcGIS Enterprise platform comes a new – and easier – login process, using your state email and password. If you have not heard from us yet regarding this change, please take a minute to read the login instructions below, as they will guide you through this process. The GIS team will contact you when it's time to setup your new account!

1.To set up your ArcGIS Enterprise account, use an internet browser to go to https://sdgis.sd.gov/portal/home/ and click on State of South Dakota.



2.On the next screen, click on State of South Dakota Employee (toward the bottom of the window).



- 3. Type in your State email address, then click Next.
- 4. You will get another screen asking you to sign into your organizational account. Use your state email address and your computer password to sign in. You may choose "Yes" to stay signed in if you wish.

Once you're signed in, please keep your profile visibility as Everyone (public) and send an email to either Kimberly or Kathryn so that we can assign you to the appropriate work groups. We'll let you know when you're ready to go!

The next time you use Field Maps on your iPad, you should choose the Enterprise login option, type https://sdgis.sd.gov/portal, and follow the same steps to sign in as you did on your computer. If your iPad is shared, please tap "No" when asked if you want to stay signed in. More info to come as we start reaching out to our users. Stay tuned!




