# Long Range Transportation Plan 2045



Misc (included content additions, data availability, oversight)




The emerging trend was related to responsibilities of roadway maintenance or improvement.






SDDOT does not currently have any plans for the development of passenger rail but it could be considered in the future.




Alternate routing of traffic within and around Sioux Falls to meet the community's needs are continually studied in the Sioux Falls metropolitan area. The SDDOT encourages public input as these roadways are analyzed in active partnership with the City of Sioux Falls through the area's MPO. Veteran's Parkway is one such route that is now entering the design phase of its project life cycle. The much needed route will be constructed in phases as determined by available funding and driven by urban growth.
